Igra Academy continues to produce outstanding GCSE results. These results help to prepare our students for life and work and to be outstanding British Citizens of the future.

100% of Students achieved 5+ GCSE passes at grade 4+.

86% of Students achieved 9+ GCSE passes at grade 4+.

64% of Students achieved higher passes in both Maths and English at grade 5+. This is well above the National average of 45% and the City of Peterborough average of 36%.

100% of Students went on to study in Further Education.

As a Community School, Parents and members of the Community are of fundamental importance, to support the schools drive for improvement. The Schools Parents Forum 'Friends of Iqra,' recent feedback included;

High Quality Education:

Our Principal Dr Michael Wright, was named 'Head teacher of the Year' at the National Interfaith Schools Education Awards sponsored by AMS UK. Mr Tom Wright collected the National 'Health & Well-Being' School Award for Iqra Academy and Governors and teachers received National recognition after being shortlisted for the following National Awards;

Teacher of the Year – Nasiba Zaib, Pastoral Care – Rehana Kauser, Educational Support – Eishrat Sultana, 3FF Interfaith – Zufie Ahmed, Community Outreach – Saqib Rehman and Transformational Leader – Tariq Nawaz.

This is testimony to how far Iqra Academy has moved forward and reflects on the hard work of all Students, Parents, teachers, Governors and Community Friends of Iqra Academy.

As part of our School's Curriculum development cycle, all Teachers undergo a Graded Lesson Observation. Areas of Good Practice and Areas for Improvement are identified and recorded. These are collated centrally and inform Staff Continuous Professional Development and Sharing Good Practice sessions. We maintain a CPD log for all staff of internal and external input into Sharing Good Practice sessions.

We record individuals Areas of Good practice and Areas for Improvement at the Teachers Annual Appraisals and Probation Reviews, where we discuss how these areas can be taken forward. Staff Development is one and practicing through Peer Observations is another.

Teachers also utilize and action feedback from Students feedback forms on Teachers. These feedback forms also contribute to the teacher's reflections and targets set in their Appraisal and Probation reviews.

Iqra Academy has developed its own Professional Learning and Development Teacher Mentoring programme. All teachers in training and new to the School have been allocated a Mentor, have completed a PLD Audit and PLD Mentoring Log, to identify and address areas for improvement.

The School's values, 'Integrity, Quality, Respect and Aspiration,' are important threads that run through all aspects of School life. (Ofsted 2022).

Where Girls learn without limits:

Iqra Academy has a progress 8 score of +1.60, which is considerably higher than the National average of -0.03. A score of +1.00 means that students are achieving one grade higher in each qualification than other similar students nationally.

For attainment, Iqra's score of 56.4 is well above the National average of 46.2 and a Peterborough City average of 42.8.

Iqra Academy achieved outstanding GCSE results, with 100% of Students achieving 5+ GCSE passes at grade 4+ and 86% of students achieving 9+ GCSE passes at grade 4+. For students achieving higher grades in both Mathematics and English GCSE, Iqra Academy 64% is well above the National average of 45% and the Peterborough City average of 36%.

Iqra's School Attendance of 95.0% is well above the National average of 93.2%. Students behave well, low level disruprution is rare and there is no bullying in the School. (Ofsted 2022).

This year, Doctoral Researchers in Science from world renowned Cambridge University carried out their Research at Iqra Academy, which included them working with Student focus groups and observing and teaching some Science lessons.

At Iqra Academy, students experience high quality lessons which enable them to make rapid progress in their learning and to help them achieve challenging personal targets.

Her Majesty's Inspectors in their Ofsted report (June 2022) concluded that "Pupils thrive at this School. Adults have high expectations and pupils work hard and are ambitious in what they want to achieve." Inspectors added "Leaders have designed a curriculum that is broad and ambitious. Low level disruption is rare and there is no bullying at the school."

Inspectors praised the leadership of teaching, learning and assessment, describing it as being "highly effective."

Iqra Academy celebrated after being shortlisted for the Sankore University Award for 'Excellence in Education' at The Muslim News National Annual Awards for Excellence, which took place in central London with guest speaker and presenter Sadiq Khan, Mayor of London.

Islamic Department

At Iqra Academy our Islamic department is entrusted to prepare, develop and deliver a curriculum and environment that does nurture the most valuable asset of our community, our children, our future.

Our dedicated Islamic team produce students who are ready to meet the challenges of an ever-changing social landscape equipping them with the high moral and ethical excellence taught by Islam.

Our team is built up of UK Islamic Graduates who have excelled within the traditional sciences and have successfully sort and gained Ijaazah (permission) from renowned institutions from around the world. Our team is supported by the Ulama Education Group of Peterborough.

Our highly dedicated team have a passion for educating with a strong proven track history in the teaching field.

The core principals of Islam are used to develop the students to have a deep appreciation of their faith and use its universal lessons to serve their communities. Display excellent character and become part of every aspect of our society as leaders, leaders who will shape society for the better.

Iqra Academy provides the following the Islamic subjects:

Quranic Studies: Appreciate the full value and enormity of the Quran.

Tajweed: The knowledge and application of the rules of recitation of the holy Quran.

Hadith Studies: Learn and put into practice how Prophet Muhammad (peace and blessings be upon) lived his life.

Islamic History: Appreciate the history behind the development of Islam.

Islamic Studies: a look at the tenants of Islam, including but not limited to beliefs, pillars, manners and conduct.

Students also get the opportunity to undertake projects relating to community service and charity.

Admissions

We are now enrolling students for year 7-11. Anyone interested in enrolling their daughter at Iqra Academy must obtain an application form, which must be filled in and sent to the Administration Office. In year transfers are also considered and an application form must be filled in.

Selection criteria: We currently only accept female students in years 7-11, after a successful interview and with an agreement with parents that fees will be paid.

The school will consider any female to join throughout the year due to exceptional circumstances. The senior management team will assess each case on its merits.

Over-subscription criteria

We are currently not an over-subscribed school. If the school should be oversubscribed the following criteria will be applied:

- 1. Children where in recognised professional opinion (a letter from a GP, Consultant, Educational Psychologist or Social Worker explaining why the child cannot attend any school other than the Academy) shows that circumstances present a particularly strong case for taking in a child.
- 2. A child with a sibling currently attending the Academy and who will continue to do so after the date of admission.
- 3. Proximity of a child's home to the Academy.

Fees

Iqra Academy is a private institution with no local authority or government grants supporting it. This academy is for everyone and is funded by the community. The running of the academy depends on fees and voluntary contributions

Fees are set annually, with a view of keeping the price as low as possible. The fees can be paid in advance, annually or monthly installments by standing order. Methods of payment will be agreed at the interview.

Student Leadership

The Student Leadership team goes from strength to strength and presented at the 'Schools of Tomorrow' National forum in Leicester and continues with SoT student research into Leadership. They have also developed their own 'RESPECT' campaign and supported the National 'PREVENT' programme being delivered in school. The Student Leadership team ran the successful 'Better Reading Support Initiative' to support pupils at local Primary Schools. Iqra Students have developed a Soup kitchen and provide food and overnight accommodation at the School for the Cities homeless and needy. Our Student Leaders also attended the Student Leadership International Conference held in Holland. Student leaders sit on the Global School Alliance Student Council, where they have gained the 'Bronze Award' for their International work.

Extra-curricular

Igra Academy was judged to be 'Outstanding' in Personal Development, providing students with outstanding opportunities to grow as active, healthy and engaged citizens, preparing them for the future. (Ofsted 2022).

Enrichment through extracurricular activates are a key feature at Iqra, The School has its own 'Enrichment Charter' and runs weekly after-school clubs for our Football and Cricket Academies, where we also compete nationally.

Iqra Academy Students won the prestigious National 'Young Writers Creative Writing Competition' and as a result have had their entries published. This annual writing competition is in its 32nd year and received in excess of 10,000 entries this year.

The establishment of a Combined Cadet Force provides a disciplined organisation in the school, so that our students develop powers of leadership. The CCF training promotes the qualities of responsibility, self -reliance, resourcefulness, endurance and perseverance.

Iqra Academy Crowned National Champions:

Iqra Academy All-conquering School Football team are the reigning Muslim Schools National Champions, having won the Title Six times in the last Seven years.

The School also competes in the English Schools FA County League and in the Peterborough & District Schools League, both of which they have previously won. They also won the Interfaith Midlands Schools Cup, the first ever Muslim school to do so. Iqra Academy has shared its success through a number of outreach programmes and is the recipient of the FA Community Award for Best Inclusive Project.

In the last two years, the School was shortlisted by the 'Muslim News' readers for their 'Excellence in Sport' at the Annual National Awards in London. This year, the team were presented with a Civic Sports Award from the City of Peterborough.
